Story 1: Job 38, Acts 17:16-34

Who Is God?



The Scriptures give us a picture of who God is throughout their pages. According to Genesis 3:8 God spent time with Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden where they talked with Him. However, because

of sin, they were separated from that communication with God. They were also condemned to death as each of us is today (Gn. 3:8-24). However, there is hope for us because of who God is (Jn. 3:17).

In Job 37, which was possibly written during the time of Abraham, Elihu pointed out the power of God. But then he said, "The Almighty -- we cannot find Him..." as if God had set things in motion but then had removed Himself from His creation.

However, beginning with Job 38, God spoke directly to Job and questioned him about many magnificent things that He had done. Finally Job 42:6 says that Job repented in dust and ashes. Job said that God could do things and that no purpose of God's could be stopped.

Throughout the Old Testament God made Himself known to many people at different times and in various ways. (Heb. 11:1-2) Some of the people were Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Joshua, Samuel, David, Elijah, Isaiah, Daniel, Haggai, etc. The glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle in the wilderness. That is where the people went to worship God. God called the tabernacle, "The tent of meeting". The tabernacle was a picture of Christ, or God the Son, who was to come (Ex. 35-40). We will learn more about the Tabernacle in Exodus.

After some four hundred years of silence, the New Testament opens with Matthew. This book began by saying that it was the book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. Luke took the lineage back to Adam who was created by God.

John began by saying, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In John 14:6 Jesus said that He

was the way, the truth and the life and that no one
comes to the Father but through Him. Jesus said
that those who had seen Him had seen the
(Jn. 14:19). In John 14:16 Jesus said
the Father would give another Helper who is the
Holy Ghost according to John 14:26. The Father,
and are one, and they
were all present at creation. (Gen.1:2, 26, Jn.1:1-3
In Acts 17 Paul pointed out the altar the
people had made to the unknown God. Paul
explained the unknown God was the of
the world and everything in it. God gives life, and
from one man He gave life to every nation. God
sovereignly determined the times and boundaries.
He said that God's divine nature is
what our minds can think of or
describe.

However, God is loving and merciful (He gives us what we do not deserve). He was willing to overlook the times man had ignored Him. God because a day of calls man to righteous judgment has been set, through His Son whom He raised from the dead. Some people rejected what Paul said, some wanted to hear more, and some joined him in belief. The New Testament ends by pointing us toward an eternity with or without God.

Not only the Scriptures, but also all that God has made clearly shows and helps us understand about God's eternal power and His divine nature (Rm. 1:18-21). No one has an excuse not to know God, who wants us to love and worship Him. Paul says that when we do not honor God or give thanks to Him, we are in danger of becoming fools and of being led into sin because of worshiping the creature rather than the Creator.

Who is God? When Moses asked that question in Exodus 3:13, God replied by saying, "I AM THAT I AM." He made us, and He wants us to come to Him. He is far more than we can understand.


