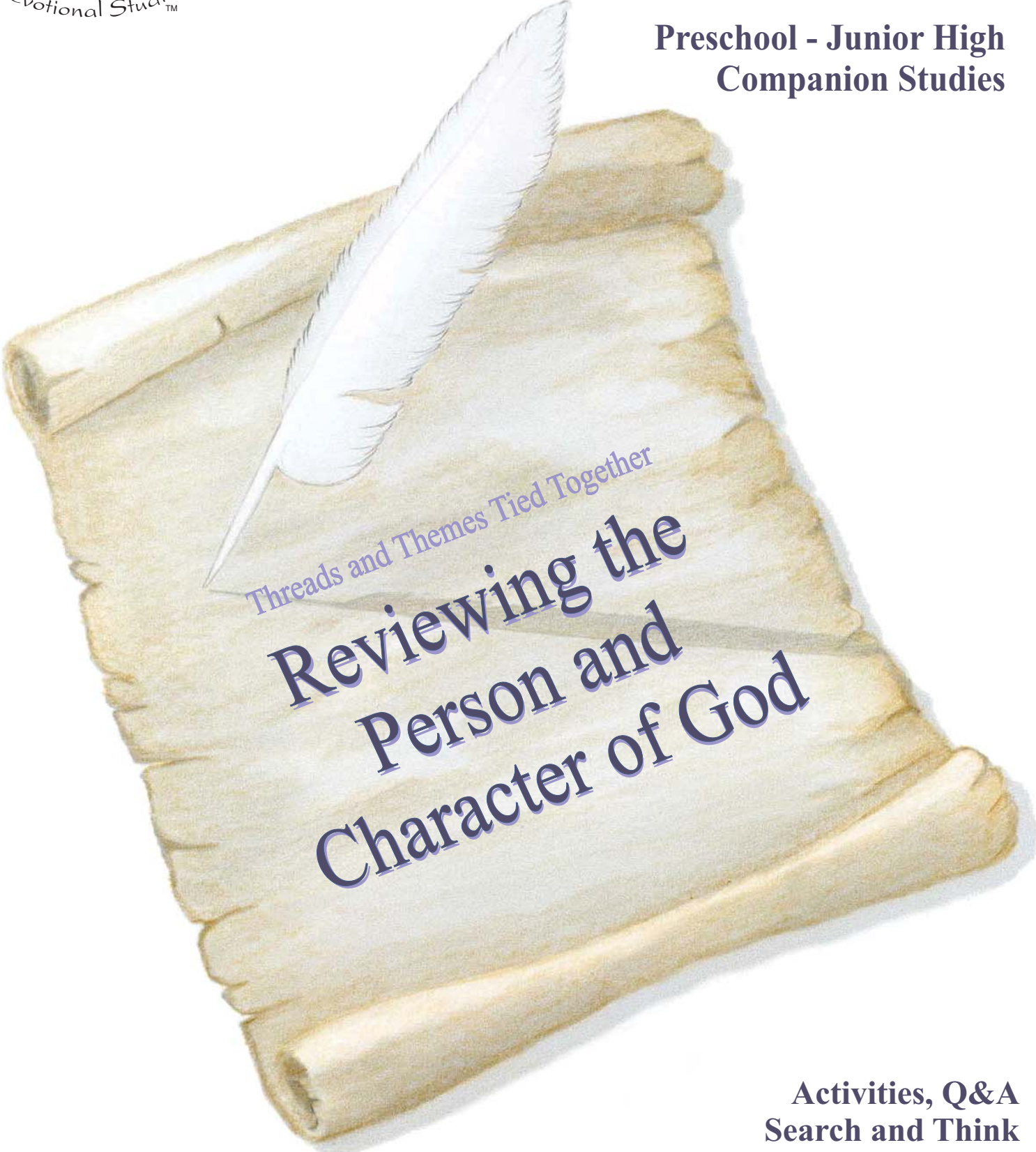

I: Why Care What God Thinks?

Reviewing the Person and Character of God – Activities

Unknown God: See Acts 17:22-31. Make a sign that says, "Unknown God."

SAY: Paul told the people about the unknown God of their altar. God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God created everything. Man should repent because God is just, and there will be a day of judgment. Jesus Christ was crucified on the cross as payment for man's sin.

God Made: Take a walk and notice things God has made. Notice clouds, birds, plants, etc. Perhaps collect things that can be made into a nature collage.

SAY: Point out things God made that they can draw such as a cloud or a flower.

The Bible and Other Books: Provide books such as: cookbook, song book, map book, picture book ... Holy Bible.

SAY: There are lots of kinds of books. The Holy Spirit used people to write down God's words.

Bible Parts: Have your child(ren) trace and match: **Old Testament, New Testament, Genesis, Matthew,** etc. Have them say some names with you.

SAY: The Bible has two big parts, Old and New Testament. Some books are: Genesis, Exodus ... Matthew

Bookmark: Make a book worm bookmark with bright colors of construction paper. Help child(ren) glue John 1:1 to the book worm to be used as a bookmark for their Bible.

SAY: God gave us His Word to tell us about Himself so we can learn to listen to Him and learn to read it.

Make a Coloring Book: Have each person make a picture with a few words, and make it into a book.

SAY: Several people helped make this book. And God's Holy Spirit helped many people write the Bible.

Reviewing the Person and Character of God - Activities

Sky and Stars: Read Psalm 139:1-12 together. God made the sky and stars.

SAY: The Creator God is the Father of Lights. He is in the heavens.

Ocean: Read some of Jonah 1 or more.

SAY: Jonah tried to run away from God across the Great Sea. God found Him there.

Rooms in a House, Sitting or Standing: Go from room to room in your house and talk about what God can see and hear.

SAY: God is in every one of these rooms. Talk about what God can see and hear.

Inside or Outside: Go outside and talk about God there. Go inside and talk about God there.

SAY: God is inside and outside. Talk about what God can see and hear.

In a Car: God is with us wherever we go in the car.

SAY: God is in every one of these places. Talk about what God can see and hear.

Woods, Mountain, Valley: Go to these kinds of places, and talk about God in these places.

SAY: God is in the woods, on the mountain, and in the valley. Talk about what God can see and hear.

Night, Day: God is in the day and in the night.

SAY: Talk about these day and night. God does not sleep. Where can you go that God cannot find you?

Bible Books Option: Leviticus, Numbers

Reviewing the Person and Character of God – Activities

Melchizedek, a Priest of God Most High: Abraham offered a sacrifice to Melchizedek.

SAY: Melchizedek met Abraham after Abraham won the battle over the 5 kings who took Lot away. (Gn 14:13-24) Melchizedek and Abraham both described God as the possessor of heaven and earth.

Function of a High Priest: He offered gifts and sacrifices for sins time after time. Show the temple.

SAY: Jesus preached about things to come and healed the sick and did many more miracles.

Day of Atonement: Show a picture of the tabernacle. Read some of **Leviticus 16** together.

SAY: Once a year on the Day of Atonement the high priest entered the holy of holies to make a blood sacrifice for himself and all the people.

Caiaphas, a high priest: Caiaphas did not accept Jesus as the Son of God. (Read Matthew 26:63-65)

SAY: When Jesus was arrested, He was taken to Caiaphas the high priest.

From Heaven to Heaven: Read **Hebrews 4:14** with your child(ren). Here Jesus is described as the great high priest.

SAY: Jesus told about coming from above (heaven) and going where they could not go (back to heaven).

Jesus, the Great High Priest: After the order of Melchizedek. Read **Heb 4:14; 5:10; 6:20** together.

SAY: Jesus took His own blood (**John 1:29, 36**) into heaven as the Great High Priest as payment made as the perfect Lamb without sin (without spot or blemish). Then He sat down at the right hand of God because this was the last sacrifice ever needed. (**Heb 9:11-12; 10:12**) Other priests never finished.

Lamb of God: Read **John 1:29, 36** together. Find, draw, or make pictures of lambs (or go see them).

SAY: God used 2 lambs as a sacrifice for clothing for Adam and Eve. Abel offered a lamb as an acceptable sacrifice to God. These sacrifices were never enough. John 1:29,36 describes Jesus as the **Lamb of God** whose blood was shed on the cross for our sins only once and that was enough.

Bible Books Option: Luke, John

BASIC TRUTHS

Introduction

Individuals have a conscience which can respond to God. We must be faithful to communicate spiritual truths to the next generation because God has commanded us to do so (Dt.). Below are some of the spiritual truths which individuals should understand.

Threads and themes

HOLY BIBLE: The Bible is God's Word to us about Himself; His Son, Jesus; the Holy Spirit and His plan for man. It should be handled respectfully. (John 1:1-14; Matthew 1:2 Peter 1:2-11)

GOD: God is one God in three Persons: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God is holy, immutable, just, loving, merciful, omnipotent, omnipresent, omniscient and sovereign; a partial list of characteristics. God and His Word will stand forever. (Genesis 1; John 1; Isaiah 40:8; Revelation 22)

GOD CREATED: God created all things including each person. (Genesis 1; Romans 1:18-25)

GOD IS RIGHTEOUS: God is perfect and cannot allow sin in His presence. (Mt. 5:48)

GOD LOVES EVERYONE: God loves each person and wants each person to be in His presence and care. (Genesis 1:26; John 3:16; John 15)

SIN SEPARATES: The first people, Adam and Eve, sinned, which separated them and everyone else from the presence and fellowship of God eternally. (Genesis 3; Romans 3:23)

SIN DEMANDS PAYMENT: Sin's penalty must be paid before a person can enter God's presence. (Romans 6:23)

JESUS PAID SIN'S PRICE: God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the price for sin for each individual by dying once as the only perfect sacrifice. (Hebrews 9:11-14; 1 Peter 1:18-19, 3:18)

INDIVIDUALS ACCEPT JESUS' PAYMENT: God, through His Word and the work and power of the Holy Spirit, draws individuals to Himself who must, by faith and repentance, accept Jesus' free gift of salvation. (John 1:12, 3:3-7; 5:24; Ephesians 1:7; 2; Acts 3:19; 17:30; 26:20; Romans 10:9-10)

JESUS IS IN HEAVEN: Jesus is in heaven today preparing a place for each person who repents and accepts the free gift of salvation by faith. (John: 14:2-3; Romans 10:9-10; Titus 3:5-7)

Basic attitudes and behavior

SHOW RESPECT: Develop respect for position (Hebrews 13:17; 1 Peter 2:17); age (Leviticus 19:32); parents (Exodus 20:1-17); peers (Genesis 1:26); property and nature (Genesis 1:28-31).

TRUST and OBEY: Develop trust and obedience to God and a hunger and thirst for righteousness. (Matthew 5:6, 10, 20; 2 Timothy 3:16)

SING SONGS and PRAISE GOD: Sing about God and to God. (Colossians 3:16)

PRAY: Talk with God in prayer. (Matthew 6:9-13; 19:14)
