



Welcome to Preparing Your Children to Leave Home with Lifetime Biblical Convictions.




Some of my background will help you understand how I came to speak on this subject. You see, both may wife and I were involved in a discipleship ministry for a number of years, my wife in college ministry and me in military and college ministries which is where we met. In that vocation, we got to see the fruit of Christian families and churches; and, it was disheartening too many times. I saw so many examples of those that strayed from the faith when left to themselves in the military and college after being raised in a Christian home. One of those examples occurred the first year of my college ministry and became a catalyst that brought me here today.

We may have a goal to raise a godly generation, but somehow that objective is being missed too many times. That is what we are going to focus on in this workshop.



Here is the outline of what we will cover, and I will go very fast but don't worry about what you miss, because I am going to show you how to get this entire PowerPoint with all the notes. So what I want you to do today is listen and jot down just a few of the areas the Lord lays on your heart to take home with you.



Parental Paradigm or Mindset.

In the very beginning, the bible establishes our parental objective for our children.

It is stated in Genesis 2:24 which is before the fall, but it is also restated 3 times in the NT. (by Jesus in Mt 19:5, Mk 10:7 and Paul in Ephesians 5: 31). It says, **"Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife and they shall become one flesh."**

That means two things:

- 1. At some point in the future, your child will and should leave your home and start his or her own home.
- That means if we take seriously our God given responsibility as parents, we should be preparing our children to leave home and be on their own.


This should be an undercurrent on our minds when we think about our children. In God's plan they will leave our home and to support God's design for our children we must prepare them for that occasion. It may be tough to think of our children that way, but if we do, then when they are at an age where it is time to leave home, we will know they have the basics for facing the world. We may look at that time with sorrow about losing them but with confidence that they have been prepared for life on their own.

So our goal should be to train our children to be on their own? We are not just to manage them but to prepare them for independence. However, what I saw in my ministry is that they may have been prepared academically but not spiritually. Before the Lord, our most important job is to prepare them spiritually. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world but looses his own soul.

Are we making the right choices before God to pass on to them for their independence?


Paradigm: Is the term used to describe the set of experiences, beliefs and values that affect the way an individual perceives reality and responds to that perception.



The next area is what I call the Teen Paradigm because,

Throughout history there has been no reference to adolescence at least until about the last century. It is not mentioned in the bible or in history for a reason.



Only in this last century have we defined adolescence as the time between when the child reaches puberty and the time they are actually considered an adult. However for the last 3000 years, until about the last century, those two events coincided. Once a child reached the teenage years, they were also considered an adult.


Two thousand years ago under Roman law, women could marry at twelve and men at fourteen. A thousand years ago under English law it was the same. Two hundred years ago under common law in the United States it was still the same—women could marry at twelve and men at fourteen. For 3000 years, the minimum legal age for marriage did not change. Of course, not everyone married at twelve or fourteen, just as everyone does not marry at eighteen today.

So, what's the point? For the first time in thousands of years, teenagers were redefined as "children." and were not allowed to make adult decisions.



Because of this we have left an area of confusion for both parent and teen. Too many times we still regard them as a child and treat them that way when they should actually be capable of adult responses and behavior. As such we have created lower expectations in their minds as well.

Now, academically these days it may take longer to be able to support themselves, but we are talking about maturity in the area of behavior and responsible attitudes.



So how do we deal with this perspective today? There are some restrictions on what the law and other people will let you do.


For example,

•We may not be able to send them out to work a job but we can see that they learn to work at home or better, take responsibility. Although they may not be able to earn much money, you can still see that they learn how to handle money wisely.

•The law will not allow them to marry, but you can help them learn how to get along in a family relationship and how to treat the opposite sex.

Even if other people expect your teenagers to act irresponsibly, you can expect them to be responsible.

This is still done successfully today in certain societies. The Bar Mitzvah in the Jewish society is an example




For example, in Jewish Culture, the Bar Mitzvah ceremony takes place at the age of 13 years of age.

>>The boy becomes a man in the eyes of the synagogue. <u>A 'man of duty' as implied in the</u> name of the ceremony, a man capable of upholding law and who is now responsible for themselves. Gone are the care free days of childhood. The young man is now seen as an adult in the eyes of Jewish Law.


>>There are privileges of all sorts that become available to the one who has had 'Bar Mitzvah'. One of these privileges is that they are now able to get up in front of everyone at temple and read from the Torah in services. It is acknowledged by the faith that full spiritual and intellectual maturity does require time, **but**

>>this ceremony opens up opportunities for the young man to have experiences that can foster building a clearer image of the self in an adult, productive capacity.

>>This stimulates the belief in what the young man can become and the place he can assume in the temple and in the Jewish society.



As a symbolic measure of the change from child to adult, the Bar Mitzvah represents that the young man has a greater understanding of what is expected of them, and greater understanding of themselves. It is in large part the **expectations** that are stimulated within the young man who is going through this initiation that drive the belief in taking his next step in growth. It is also the **belief and expectation** of those around him in his family, friends, and church that help drive this growing belief.



>> Adjust your expectations for teens and those approaching teens. Prepare them for what is expected of them when they reach that age. But, don't dump the truck, allow them to grow. After all, you are still growing spiritually.

>> Expect Adult behavior at 12 to 13 years – Kind, considerate, humble, responsible, respecting others and property


>> Treat them like adults – Freedom should be accompanied by self discipline. Responsibilities should be handled on their own initiative, i.e. without being told. They should own their responsibilities as it is only right for them to contribute to the family. This is very important and I go in to detail about how to do this in the Preschool workshop. There I outline some of the transitional principles of how to begin to help your child move from child thinking to adult thinking.

>> <u>Adjust your teaching methods</u> – Start asking them what the right or best thing is to do. Asking what their thinking is for their choices for what they want to do. Involving them in the decision making process. Your instruction takes the form of helping them to think through their choices and decisions. With freedom comes accountability which means that for a while, they must agree to let you know how they have used their freedom and talk through their choices, decisions and results!! I.e. they must earn your trust showing that they know how to make wise choices and will choose to make wise choices. *Make sure they have a proper understanding that Scriptural principles should take presidence in their choices and decisions*.

Allowing them to fail and make mistakes. <u>No Fatal Mistakes !!!!</u> Be wise! And talking through what happened and maybe what would be better next time approaching them from a helping standpoint, not a dictator. Outwardly recognizing their good decisions and actions. If they stay up too late, they have to pay the price the next day. But we don't lower our performance expectations. We focus on holding them responsible for results rather than managing their time and activities. They need to also understand that if they abuse a privilege they may loose it until they have e demonstrated self control. Make sure you communicate your expectations ahead of time so they know what is expected.

>> Target your instructions for independence – Encourage them to be **independent with accountability** to you for a while. They should be learning those areas that help them function successfully in the world both spiritual and non-spiritual. Spiritually, they should be prepared for the worlds values and know how to deal with those values and how to respond, both intellectually and with a proper attitude.


Transistion: So what is our part for passing on spiritual convictions?


I have added his next section to the workshop because I am seeing it missed too many times due to improper presumptions about <u>salvation</u>

We have to understand the spiritual condition of our child especially their inherited condition. We have to understand that even though our child is changing constantly from birth to adulthood there is one issue that is consistent. I probably don't need to tell you this, but I am anyway. Your child is a sinner and was from the start. Without the Lord in their lives, they are hopelessly lost in sin. That is what the Bible tells us. Some say we come into the world with a clean slate; and in some areas maybe we do, but not in the area of sin. We don't have to teach them how to sin they come with that innate ability and left to their natural condition, their sin nature will bear the fruit of its kind.

Refs:

All we like sheep have gone astray, we have turned everyone to his own way – Isa 53:6 For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God – Rom 3:23

So, what do we know about that condition?



What does that mean about teaching biblical convictions?

Read Verses:

We must recognize that without Christ and the Lord's spirit to teach us and open our hearts and minds to the truths of God's word, we will not understand or see the value in filling our lives with a focus on pleasing the Lord according to His Word. It just won't happen. We might try to fit in to the social environment at church, but our underlying guide will be our sin nature. We might deceive some, but the Lord is not deceived.

Why? Because we become a different person when Christ is in our life and heart.

We must be born again just as Jesus told Nicodemus in John 3. So it is with your children.

So, what is our primary objective for your child to begin learning biblical convictions? - Salvation

What are the basic concepts involved in salvation?

- Acknowledge the God of the Bible is our God and our creator
- Recognize God as Righteous and Holy
- Recognize our <u>sinfulness</u> (Rom 3:23) (Teaching biblical standards will help)
- Recognize there are and should be <u>consequences</u> for our sin. (commission and/or omission) (It is a Heart Issue) (Rom 6:23) Normal discipline should teach them this principle.
- Recognize that the consequences of our sin is <u>separation</u> from God.
- Recognize that God sent His only Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the consequences for our sin so that we could
 once again commune with the God.
- Recognize our separation and need then calling on the Lord Jesus Christ for our salvation. It is a free gift
 for those that recognize their sinfulness repent and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ's death as the
 atonement for our sin.

We must be born again just as Jesus told Nicodemus in John 3. So it is with your children.





So how do we get them where they need to be?

I have outlined some of our **practical Biblical responsibilities** in an acronym I call LIPP Service.

Let's start in the OT



That brings us to what the Lord tells us we should do to develop biblical convictions in our children.

That brings us to an acrostic I call LIPP Service.

The L for Life, starts with the first two verses. These tell us the basic underlying spiritual principle that we must pass on to our children. The goal is that the Lord must be the priority of our life.

Read the first two verses.

This is the biblical standard!


The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!

According to this verse, God's first requirement is that He is first?

Its simple, all means all ! And that is all all means !

Lk 9:23, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily.

So how do we teach this to our children?



Think about how you taught your child vocabulary?

So, if the Lord has not been a priority in your life during their early years, you have probably already taught them it is not a priority for them as well. That means you have something to overcome besides their natural sin nature.

The first requirement is for parents to set the proper example.

What is the example in Luke 10 Martha Martha vs Mary

Parental Responsibility

Life: Reflect a Proper Example

Luke 10:38-42 – Martha and Mary

³⁸ Now it happened as they went that He entered a certain village; and a certain woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. ³⁹ And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word.
⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore tell her to help me."

⁴¹ And Jesus answered and said to her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things.

⁴² But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her."

Preparing Hearts to Weather the Storms of Life

Here is what I mean:

My first response...

Martha, Martha – Lk. 10:38-42 - Do you not care... The key is what we care about.

Martha Martha: Why is it that Martha made the wrong choice? What was she missing?

- 1. She did not understand who Jesus was. Jn 1:1-5 Did she really understand who she was talking to?
- 2. She forgot or never knew how big God is
- 3. She forgot who Jesus was and was taking control instead of turning control over to the Lord and seeking Him first
- 4. Her care, priority, was messed up
- 5. Her serving may have been more of a distraction from His words to those listening.
- 6. She needed to let him be in control of the timing for being served. Those who came wanted and needed to hear Him!



Dads often set the family focus. Sports, fishing, computers... It is ok to enjoy these areas, they also serve to train our children to live in the world, however, our children need to see that although you enjoy these areas, your life's focus is the Lord.

They need to understand that these things come a distant second to your focus on the Lord and His service.


For instance, do your children ever catch you reading your Bible, just you and the Lord? Or praying?

Ministry - One of the key areas to show your commitment to Christ is to be involved in some kind of ministry. James 2, Faith without works is dead.

If you want to pass on spiritual convictions to your children, make sure they are alive in your own life. You can't pass on something you don't have.


Ministry also helps you grow and it holds you accountable. Often, ministry allows you to include your children as well. What does your ministry commitment communicate to your children about your commitment to the Lord?

If you were put on trial for being a Christian, would you be convicted? Most importantly, would your children convict you?



We are here at this homeschool convention and most of us are looking for materials that will help them achieve their academic goals for their children and that is OK. But what about our spiritual goals for our children? Are we seeking academic excellence and depending on the church for the spiritual aspect. That's what those college freshmen's parents did for them 30+ years ago and it didn't work then and it certainly won't work today.

The next area is Instruction.



To start,


I picked Proverbs 2 because it epitomizes the spiritual goal we should have for our children. And, rather than tell you what is here, I am going to give you a chance to let the Lord show you what needs to happen from your own brief time in this passage. So for the next 10 minutes I need you to work on the study in your handout. The Proverbs 2 passage is in your handout.

So how did you feel when I told you to do some work? Did you feel cheated? Did you expect me to give you some quick easy things to do to spiritually train your children?

So, How do we prepare them spiritually?

A while back, I went to a **Teach Them Diligently** homeschool conference.

READ: What is them in this passage? God's Words


READ : And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart.

Notice it says heart, not head? Know why?

Ps 119: 9 & 11 How shall a young man cleans his way, by taking heed thereto according to thy word. Thy word have I hidden in my heart that I might not sin against thee.

It is what is in your heart that changes your life!

Prov 23: ⁷ For as he thinks in his heart, so *is* he.



It says we are to aim for the heart. How do we do that?

... teach them diligently Deut. 6:7 - Make it relative to their life.


Look for motivated moments within real life circumstances - Remember when they were really young and liked to do certain chores they avoid now? Those areas still exist both in life skills and spiritual training. Think.

Whet their appetite. How? Stretch them. Get ahead of them in real life training. Get involved in their struggles and trials and encourage and exhort them. Look at Paul's letters and how he dealt with the existing challenges in the churches.

Talk about the challenges they will have now and will have in the future and discuss how the scriptures teaches us to respond.

Talk of them ... sit, walk, lie down, rise up. This is a combination of identifying the motivated moments, stretching them and talking through the issues and challenges as you join them in their struggles. Talk about these challenges as fellow travelers in a challenging world, not always having all the answers, but helping them discover the answers themselves.

Take time to think about these areas and discuss them with your spouse. Your children are worth it!




So how do we aim for the heart?

Borrowed Spirituality - College Freshmen


This is what Lamp & Quill Bible Curriculum is all about. We are not just filling their heads with information about the Bible. Heart interaction is the focus of our Bible curriculum to help children see how the Scriptures interacts with their lives. It is also why all six years of our curriculum starts with Toddler and goes all the way through college adult so that the whole family can be in the same passage at the same time at their own age level.

It is the saying give a man a fish and he will eat for a day. Teach a man to fish and he will eat for a lifetime. !!


Circle of choices in life, will you stay on course?I

But Here is the Challenge


We all are constantly exposed to the world's values and beliefs; we cannot go to the grocery store, watch TV or commercials, everywhere we go we are constantly being exposed to the world's values and propaganda.

The question is how we deal with it? Will we choose the straight and narrow? Our kids will know what we choose. It will come out in our behavior to them and the world.

Hallmark movies: "I just want you to be happy"

Another question:

Are we so exposed to the world and it's thinking that we may not recognize when we have strayed from the truth?



Lets talk about the different perspectives between the world, the counsel of the ungodly, and the biblical perspective. We are looking to establishing a benchmark. Look at page 4 in your handout.

If we are going to protect our children from the world's values, we must be acutely aware of the differences and how they play out. Scripture:

Notice that it does not say be aware, a passive word, but beware, an active word.

And we do that by constantly refreshing ourselves in God's word.

Let's look closely at other examples you may not be all familiar with.

What Can a Preschool Child Learn?

About God?

And more... About the Church?


About his Home About Reaching Others with the Gospel?

Now that we have explored the differences between lets look at some possible examples.

List:

List, Secular Influence in CE. What is this List Teaching? How did this list get created? How do you get a decent doctrinal statement with content that does not match? Doctrinal Statement is by Biblical Scholars vs Content by Educational Specialists or Curriculum Experts, Psychologists, Sociologists: Trained by the world.

So, How did we get here? -


Problem is 3 vs 4 buckets. The world can only accept the physical, mental, emotional. They do not have a biblical spiritual bucket for interpreting observations because they have rejected God and Jesus Christ as God in the flesh.

1 Cor 2:14 – But the natural man receives not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness to him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

Fransis Shaffer used the word **Synthesis** – Describe. There is no synthesis with God's word, as soon as you compromise the truth, it is no longer truth. When we compromise with the truth, we compromise with the devil. You don't compromise with the devil.

So, how do we deal with this?

Matt 7:15-20 Describes what we are dealing with.



Let's take a look at what could be another pervasive influence even here.

Begging the question story

What kind of wisdom are we seeking first for our children? What are the choices we are making in our search for training our children?

Eve made an academic decision 6000 + years ago. ⁶ So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate. Gen 3.

What kind of wisdom are we seeking first for our children? What are the choices we are making in our search for training our children

Satan:

What was Satan's message? Disputed God's directive. So what should your response be if someone or some organization disputes God's Word?

Eve:

She was searching for wisdom over pleasing the Lord and was wiser after her poor choice, especially when she lost all she had in the garden. So what will we exchange in this life for the next? Will we hold on to this life and the world's promises and loose our children's place in eternity?

Adam:

I don't know where Adam was during this intercourse but if he was there what should he have done?

Scariest verse in the bible:

So are the choices we are making show we have the right priorities for what we are teaching our children?

Begging the Question or Circular Reasoning


In philosophy or logic, it is a fallacious argument. Stated, it is a fallacy that attempts to prove something when it has first assumed some aspect necessary for the conclusion in the argument. Here is an example where we put all three of these concepts together:

Before I went back to college, I had been taught about the importance of presuppositions in what I was going to get from professors. It was a valuable concept for me to survive the views I was presented at a very liberal university. I had a professor in a logic class who had been a religion professor and acknowledged that he had become an **empiricist**. In other words, he had rejected anything he could not prove by his own observation and reasoning. i.e. Empirically.

We were taught types of arguments and types of fallacies. Sometimes in class we would sit in a circle and he would call on one of us to give an example of a fallacy he named. One time, I was asked to give an example of Begging the Question. I said empiricism or Empirical Reasoning. He agreed. So, even though he was an empiricist, he agreed that it was based on a fallacious argument.

So, what was it that he had presumed in his belief in Empiricism that made it a fallacy?

The Answer: The fallacy was that even though the empiricist's has limits of his intelligence, learning, observation skills, and authority, he is asking us to accept him as qualified to be sufficient proof of his conclusions about what is truth. His belief presumed that he was able and qualified to determine truth. That is the risk of relying on logic and debate. We aren't all knowing. Jesus said in John 1: 18 "No one has **seen God** at any time. The only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He has declared *Him."*



Know your Bible

Counterfeit Detection & Ps 1: 2&3

40 to 50 new religions are started every year. Any one of them could cause our children to lose their way. Be grounded in the Scriptures. That is the main reason we have written Lamp & Quill Curriculum. We want them to really know the Scriptures. We want God's Word to be in both their thinking and in their hearts.





The next area is Prayer



Jesus gave us an example when He prayed for us and His disciples. John 17:

If it was important for Jesus to pray, it is absolutely important for you to pray.



So I am not going to tell you how to plant and water, I am going to show you then we talk about about what has happened.





Let's look at a passage that describes the direction we want to go. Mt 7:13 & 14

Circle of choices in life, our goal is to teach our children to make the right choices and to know when they are being led astray.

Our life can be like the USS Huron

It is important for everyone to learn to constantly adjust to stay on course and to recognize those that would lead us astray.

Part of protecting our life choices is to keep foreign objects out of our decisions. It is like the Trojan Horse which was used to protect them for 9 years from the Greeks until they let a small group inside their walls and resulted in their destruction in one night.

So the question is how do we get through the narrow gate?

STOP

B52 guidance. Just like that old ship, aircraft still use a compass system. For example the B52 in long journeys over 1000s of miles with refueling it used an Astrotracker that looked to the stars for directional correction. We have to do the same thing. Our compass system is compromised by our human nature and ignorance that is why we have to constantly look to the Heavens for God's guidance in His Word.



Encourage progressively earned freedoms & responsibility: As they are ready give them freedom to make their own choices, but teach them to talk though their decisions by asking what their thinking is.

Shift control to your child before you lose it to them. Don't block their maturing or give them complete freedom before they are responsible enough to handle it.

The key is to maintain the right balance of freedom and control. But your aim is to teach them how to use their freedom while they are still in your home. We want them to become wisely and biblically self reliant.

Adjust your parenting style to accommodate spiritual growth.

Progressively give your control and teach them to be self sufficient.

So, give your child freedom within bounds when you can. It is with freedom that opportunities for training arise. All freedom is within bounds. Even God's freedom is bounded by His character of love, holiness, righteousness, justice, etc. etc. And that is a key point; our job is to help them learn to be free within the bounds of a love for God and man as guided by the Scriptures.

Our style of parenting needs to fit where the child is and where we want them to go. It is not an all control or no control Both our parenting and our teaching styles should change **based on maturity not age**. **Preschooler:**

For instance, at the preschool age, we have to dictate what they do, but we can start teaching them to do things on their own and to make wise decisions. Our teaching initially takes the form of providing instruction. But once they have been instructed, we need to have them stop and think about what they are doing or the choices they are making and evaluate how it aligns with our instructions. Ask them why they are making the choices they are making.

Our objective should be to teach our children to stop and think about what they are doing. They need to get off of automatically doing whatever they feel like doing and consider what should be done. Being considerate of others, doing what they are supposed to do, doing what is best. We all need to ask that question of what is best.

This will not come naturally. You are going to have to stop them in their tracks from acting instinctively to consider the direction and motivation for their actions. When you ask them why they did that and they say "I don't know" That is a motivated opportunity to teach them about their sin nature and it's consequences.

Paul describes this in Romans 7: The children need to learn to differentiate how their natural tendencies differ from God's standards. Romans 7: excerpts

¹⁴ For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. ¹⁵ For what I am doing, I do not understand.

¹⁸ For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but <u>how to perform what</u> is good I do not find.

²¹ I find then a law, that evil is present with me, the one who wills to do good. ²² For I delight in the law of God according to the inward man. ²³ But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members.

²⁴ O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? ²⁵ I thank God—through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with the mind I myself serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin.
